

forgive

/fərˈgiv/ *verb*



The common definition for "forgive" is "to cease to feel resentment against (an offender)", according to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary. However, the history of the word guides us to its deeper meaning.

The Old English word "forgiefan" means "to give, grant, allow; remit (a debt), pardon (an offense)", with the Late Old English definition expanding to mean "to give up desire or power to punish". Forgiveness can also be defined by its two origin words: "for-", which means "away"; and "ghebh", which means "to give or receive".

Saint of the Week

Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo

Saint Turibius was born in Mogrovejo, a small village in Spain. He began his career in the legal profession, becoming a professor of law, and then a chief judge.

Later on, Saint Turibius was ordained priest, and then was sent to the archdiocese of Lima in Peru to lead it as its bishop. There, he struggled to help in the recovery and reform of the community as they faced poverty, as well as abuses from Spanish conquerors and the local clergy.
