

Challenge Of The Day

Today, pray to Jesus to help you find your way to God the Father, through Him, the Son of God.


Saints of the Week

Saint Phillip and James

Saint Phillip the Apostle came from Galilee. After Jesus asked Peter and Andrew to follow Him, He next asked Philip to do the same. While Philip was a married man with children, he did not hesitate when the Lord asked him to follow Him.

Saint Phillip was the one who convinced Nathaniel to also follow the Lord. In the story of the loaves and fishes, Philip was the one to which Jesus talked about the difficulty of feeding the people.





There are actually two apostles with "James" as their name. The Saint James who is celebrated with Saint Phillip is sometimes called Saint James "the Less", either because he was younger or smaller in stature than the other Saint James.

Saint James was the son of Alpheus and Mary of Clopas. James and Jude, his brother, were called to be apostles in the second year of Jesus' preaching.








Quote of the Week

... As soon as Philip had come to the knowledge that Christ was the true Messiah, he endeavored to bring others to Him and make them also acquainted with His word. Have you, at any time during your life, brought any one to Christ, or to the knowledge of His word and to His love? Or, have you, not on the contrary, led many a one to Satan and persuaded him to serve the Evil One?





The first took place when you, by your good example or kind words, converted any one to the true faith, or moved him to repentance, or confession, or to hear Holy Mass, and the word of God, or to have patience under adversity, or to any other Christian virtue.

The second happened when you, by word or deed, enticed others to evil, or confirmed them in evil doing. If you have been guilty of the last, oh, repent, as long as you live, of the wickedness that you have caused, and leave nothing untried to bring the soul, which you delivered to Sa-

tan, back to Christ. Should it, however, be too late, endeavor earnestly to lead other souls to Christ by your pious life, devout conversation, and fervent prayer.

... St. James, in imitation of the Savior, prayed even for his bitterest enemies. Shall the noble example of your Savior make less impression upon you? Consider it well. Your Savior prayed aloud upon the Holy Cross for those who caused Him infinitely more suffering than your enemies have caused you, and will you hesitate to pray for them? Shame on you! Cast at once all hesitation aside, and offer today


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all your prayers to God for those who have ever done you any harm. At the same time, promise your Omniscient God that you will forgive all, without any exception, for anything by which they have wronged you. This is one of the surest means to gain from God remission of your own sins.

Gospel Reading John 6:44-51

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Reflection Guide Question

What did Jesus mean when He said "whoever eats this bread will live forever"?

Challenge Of The Day

Today, if you can, receive Jesus in Holy Communion and reflect about His gift of eternal life.

May 6, 2022 *Friday*

First Reading Acts 9:1-20

He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?"

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 117:1-2

Praise the Lord, all you nations; glorify Him, all you peoples! Friday of the Third Week of Easter

Gospel Reading John 6:52-59

"Unless you eat the Flesh of the Son of Man and drink his Blood, you do not have life within you."

Reflection Guide Question

Why does Jesus repeatedly emphasize that life, in fact eternal life, can only be gained through Him?

Challenge Of The Day

Today, think back to your First Communion and reflect about the importance of the sacrament.

May 7, 2022 Saturday

First Reading Acts 9:31-42

"Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you. Get up nd make your bed." ... "Tabitha, rise up."

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 116:12-17

My vows to the Lord I will pay in the presence of all His people. Saturday of the Third Week of Easter

Gospel Reading John 6:60-69

"The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe."

Reflection Guide Question

In the Gospel, who were the people who, according to Jesus, "do not believe"?

Challenge Of The Day

Today, say a prayer for the people in your life who "do not believe", and ask God to help them find faith.

May 8, 2022Sunday

First Reading Acts 13:14, 43-52

... They were filled with jealousy, and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 100:1-3, 5

Know that the Lord is God; He made us, and we are His; His people, the flock He tends.

Second Reading Revelation 7:9, 14b-17

For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water ... Fourth Sunday of Easter

Gospel Reading John 10:27-30

"My sheep hear My voice; I know them, and they follow Me."

Reflection Guide Question

Why did Jesus use the metaphor of "sheep" to describe the relationship between us and Him?

Word of the Week

sheep /SHēp/ noun



Sheep are the type of animal mentioned most frequently in the Bible. Exact numbers vary, depending on the translation, but estimates are usually close to 500 times. "Sheep" is mentioned around 210 times, "lamb" around 200 times, and "ram" around 160 times. Goats, bulls, horses, donkeys, and lions, in that order, are the next most mentioned animals in the Bible.



Scientific studies about animal behavior and brain function have increasingly proven that sheep have "highly sophisticated social and emotional recognition skills using faces, voices and smells." In fact, sheep have been found to be "able to recognize and remember many different sheep and humans for several years or more" and "appear to have some capacity for forming mental images of the faces of absent individuals".



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These scientific studies reinforce what Jesus says in John 10:27 ("My sheep hear My voice"), and what shepherds and other people who care for sheep already know—that sheep know their shepherds, quite literally.

Pour out Your Holy Spirit on us so that, as our Shepherd knows us and provides for us in every affliction,










