
# Word of the Week

Mother of the Church /'maTHar av THē CHarCH / noun

- The Blessed Virgin Mary has many honorific titles in the Roman Catholic Church. One of these titles is "Mother of the Church", or "Matter Ecclesiae" in Latin.
- The title was officially given to Mary by Pope Paul VI, who said, "The Blessed Mother of God, the New Eve, Mother of the Church, continues in heaven








her maternal role with regard to Christ's members, cooperating with the birth and growth of divine life in the souls of the redeemed."

The Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church, was observed for the first time in 2018.



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Pope Francis set the celebration of the memorial to be held during the first Monday following Pentecost, following the prior publication of the decree "Ecclesia Mater" by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments.



In his homily, Pope Francis said that "the Church is feminine", citing the fact that the words "church" and "bride" are both grammatically feminine in the Italian Language. He also related the word "mother", "mater" in Latin, to the word "matter". "In His Mother, the God of heaven, the infinite God, made Himself small. He became matter, not only to be with us but also to be like us," he said.



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"This feminine dimension of the Church, which, when it is not there, the Church loses its identity and becomes a charitable organization or a football team, or whatever, but not the Church," Pope Francis continued.



In dedicating a day to celebrate Mary, Mother of the Church, a week after Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, Pope Francis aimed to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety".

Challenge Of The Day

Sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done wondrous deeds. Friday of the Tenth Week of Ordinary Time Saint Barnabas

Gospel Reading Matthew 5:33-37

Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow ... Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the Evil One.

#### **Reflection Guide Question**

When was the last time you broke a promise? Why did you do it? Why is it important to keep one's word?


Challenge Of The Day

# Quotes of the Week

On this feast day in which we celebrate God: the mystery of the one God. This God is the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Three persons, but God is one! The Father is God; the Son is God; the Spirit is God. But they are not three gods: it is one God in three Persons. It is a mystery that Jesus Christ revealed to us: the Holy Trinity.



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Today we pause to celebrate this mystery, because the Persons are not adjectives of God, no. They are real, diverse, different Persons; they are not—as that philosopher used to say—'emanations of God', no, no! They are Persons.

There is the Father to whom I pray with the "Our Father"; there is the Son, who gave me redemption, justification; there is the Holy Spirit who abides in us and inhabits the Church.




The Father is love; the Son is love; the Holy Spirit is love. Inasmuch as He is love, God, while being one alone, is not solitude but communion, among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Because love is essentially a gift of self, and in its original and infinite reality it is the Father who gives Himself by generating His Son, who in turn gives Himself to the Father, and their mutual love is the Holy Spirit, the bond of their unity. It is not easy to understand, but we can live this mystery; all of us, we can live it a great deal.



Christians are baptized "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". Before receiving the sacrament, they respond to a three-part question when asked to confess the Father, the Son and the Spirit: "I do." The faith of all Christians rests on the Trinity.



Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names, for there is only one God, the almighty Father, His only Son and the Holy Spirit: the Most Holy Trinity.

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself.


## **Game of the Week**


